AMENDMENT TO JACKSON PARISH BUILDING CODE ORDINANCE NO. 06-0609-2008 AS AMENDED AUGUST 11, 2008 AND AS AMENDED IN ORDINANCE NO. 08-1117-2011

AN ORDINANCE OF THE JACKSON PARISH POLICE JURY AMENDING THE JACKSON PARISH BUILDING CODE ORDINANCE AS REFLECTED IN ORDINANCE NO. 01-0609-2008 AS AMENDED ON AUGUST 11, 2008, AND AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 08-1117-2011 SO AS TO DELETE IN ITS ENTIRETY SECTION 1-14 AND PROVIDING FOR MATTERS RELATED THER5ETO.

WHEREAS the Jackson Parish Police Jury desires to amend its existing Building Code so as to delete in its entirety Section 1-14:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Police Jury of Jackson Parish, in regular session, duly convened on the 11th day of June, 2012, that Ordinance No. 03-0611-2012, as amended on August 11, 2008, and as further amended in Ordinance No. 08-1117-2011 be and is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION ONE

Section 1-14 of the Jackson Parish Building Code is hereby deleted in its entirety.

SECTION TWO

Except as herein modified all previously enacted provisions of the above referred to Ordinances be and the same shall hereby remain unchanged.

SECTION THREE

Should any portion, items, applications or sections of this ordinance be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions, items, applications or sections of this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provisions, items, applications or sections and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared severable.

SECTION FOUR

This ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption.

The above ordinance was read and as read, considered section by section and finally adopted as a whole by the following vote:

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Garrett and seconded by Mr. Treadway:

RESOLUTION

A resolution ordering and calling a special election to be held in the Parish of Jackson, State of Louisiana, to authorize the levy of a special tax therein; making application to the State Bond Commission in connection therewith; and providing for other matters in connection therewith.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jackson, State of Louisiana (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing authority of the Parish of Jackson, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), that:

SECTION 1. Election Call. Subject to the approval of the State Bond Commission, and under the authority conferred by Article VI, Sections 26, 30 and 32 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, the applicable provisions of Chapter 5 and Chapter 6-A of the Louisiana Election Code, and other constitutional and statutory authority, a special election is hereby called and ordered to be held in the Parish on **TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 6, 2012**, between the hours of six o'clock (6:00) a.m., and eight o'clock (8:00) p.m., in accordance with the provisions of La. R.S. 18:541, and at the said election there shall be submitted to all registered voters qualified and entitled to vote at the said election under the Constitution and laws of this State and the Constitution of the United States, the following proposition, to-wit:

PROPOSITION (MILLAGE RENEWAL)

Summary: 10 year, 2.5 mills property tax renewal for constructing, improving, maintaining, operating and supporting facilities, programs and activities for the elderly in the Parish through the Jackson Council on the Aging.

Shall the Parish of Jackson, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), levy a tax of two and one-half (2.5) mills on all the property subject to taxation in the Parish (an estimated \$555,000 expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the year 2015 and ending with the year 2024, for the purpose of constructing, improving, maintaining, operating and supporting facilities and programs for the elderly in the Parish through the Jackson Council on the Aging?

SECTION 2. Publication of Notice of Election. A Notice of Special Election shall be published in the *Jackson Independent*, a newspaper of general circulation within the Parish, published in Jonesboro, Louisiana, and being the official journal of the Parish, once a week for four consecutive
