

The following ordinance was presented by Mr. O. F. Wheelis who moved its adoption, and was seconded by Mr. W. W. Anderson:

ORDINANCE No. 2, 1959

An ordinance providing for the creation of Hospital Service District No. 1 of the Parish of Jackson, State of Louisiana, defining and describing the boundaries thereof, and providing for other details in connection therewith.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jackson, State of Louisiana, acting as the governing authority of said Parish:

SECTION 1. That under and by virtue of the authority conferred by Article XIV, Section 14 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana for the year 1921, as amended, Chapter 10, Title 46 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, and other constitutional and statutory authority supplemental thereto, a Hospital Service District be and the same is hereby created within the Parish of Jackson, State of Louisiana, which Hospital Service District shall comprise and embrace all of that territory within the Parish of Jackson, Louisiana and the boundaries of said Hospital Service District shall be coextensive with the boundaries of said Parish, as presently constituted.

SECTION 2. That the said Hospital Services District hereby created shall be and is hereby designated as "Hospital Service District No. 1 of the Parish of Jackson, State of Louisiana", and as thus created, shall constitute a body corporate and political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, and as such, shall have all the rights, powers and privileges granted and conferred by the Constitution and Statutes of the State of Louisiana, including the authority to incur debt, to issue bonds, and to levy taxes.

SECTION 3. That in accordance with the provisions of Section 1053 of Title 46 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 (R.S. 46:1053), the following named persons, each possessing the qualifications required by law, be and they are hereby appointed as Commissioners of said Hospital Service District, and shall remain in office as such during the respective terms of office shown immediately following their names:

O. M. Gresham and Sammy Thomas who shall serve for a term of two (2) years:

Lucilee Steadman and E. F. Brown who shall serve for a term of four (4) years; and

I. B. Peters who shall serve for a term of six (6) years.

SECTION 4. That the domicile of said Hospital Service District be and the same is hereby designated as the Police Jury Room of the Courthouse, Jonesboro, Louisiana, which domicile is within the corporate limits of said Hospital Service District, and the Commissioners hereby appointed shall meet at said domicile on _____, _____, 1959, at _____ (_____) O'clock _____M., and proceed to organize and elect their officers, all in the form and manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. That a copy of this ordinance shall be duly published in the Official Journal of the Parish of Jackson, Louisiana, as provided by law.

SECTION 6. That all other ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 7. That this ordinance, being an ordinance affecting the public peace, health and safety, shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption.

This ordinance having been submitted in writing, having been read and adopted by sections at a public meeting of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jackson, Louisiana, was then submitted to an official vote as a whole, the vote thereon being as follows:
