A resolution making application to the State Bond Commission for consent and approval of the issuance of not exceeding Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) of Certificates of Indebtedness, Series 2015, of the Parish of Jackson, State of Louisiana, and providing for other matters in connection therewith.

WHEREAS, the Budget for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2015, of the Parish of Jackson, State of Louisiana (the "Issuer"), shows an excess of revenues (including balances brought forward) over statutory, necessary and usual charges for such fiscal year sufficient to pay the annual debt service in any year on the hereinafter described Certificates of Indebtedness, Series 2015, of the Issuer (the "Certificates"); and

WHEREAS, this Police Jury, acting as the governing authority of the Issuer, will obligate itself and its successors in office to budget and set aside annually adequate funds for the payment of the Certificates in principal and interest in future years; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer desires to incur debt and issue not exceeding Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) of the Certificates in the manner authorized and provided by Sections 2921 to 2925, inclusive of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended (R.S. 33:2921 to 2925) (the "Act"), for the purposes hereinafter set forth; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer is not now a party to any other contract pledging or dedicating its excess annual revenues above statutory, necessary and usual charges; and

WHEREAS, the Police Jury now wish to apply to the State Bond Commission to obtain its approval for the issuance of the Certificates;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jackson, State of Louisiana, acting as the governing authority thereof, that:

SECTION 1. Application is hereby made to the Louisiana State Bond Commission for consent and authority for the Parish of Jackson, State of Louisiana, to issue, sell and deliver not

exceeding Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) of Certificates of Indebtedness, Series 2015, of the Issuer, all in the manner provided by the Act, for the purpose of providing funds for constructing and improving the Issuer's roads and bridges (the "Project") and paying the costs of issuance of the Certificates. The Certificates will be sold at par, will mature annually no later than ten (10) years from the date thereof, and bear interest at a rate or rates not exceeding four per centum (4%) per annum. The Certificates shall be secured by and payable from a pledge and dedication of the excess of annual revenues of the Issuer above statutory, necessary and usual charges in each of the fiscal years during which the Certificates are outstanding.

SECTION 2. A certified copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to said State Bond Commission, together with a letter requesting the prompt consideration and approval of this application.

SECTION 3. By virtue of Issuer's application for, acceptance and utilization of the benefits of the Louisiana State Bond Commission's approval requested herein, this Governing Authority resolves that it understands, agrees and binds itself, its successors and assigns to, full and continuing compliance with the "State Bond Commission Policy on Approval of Proposed Use of Swaps, or other forms of Derivative Products Hedges, Etc.", adopted by the Commission on July 20, 2006, as to the borrowing and other matters subject to the approval, including subsequent application and approval under said Policy of the implementation or use of any swap(s) or other product(s) or enhancement(s) covered thereby.

SECTION 4. Prior to the delivery of the Certificates, the Issuer intends to expend moneys from other available funds for the Project and reasonably expects to reimburse said expenditures from the proceeds of the Certificates in an amount not exceeding \$3,000,000. Any such allocation of proceeds of the Certificates for reimbursement will be with respect to capital expenditures (as defined in Treasury Reg. 1.150-1[b]) and will be made upon the delivery of the Certificates and not later than eighteen (18) months after the later of (i) the date such expenditure was paid or (ii) the date on which the Project was placed in service. This Section is intended to be a declaration of official intent within the meaning of Reg. 1.150-2.

SECTION 5. This Governing Authority finds and determines that a real necessity exists for the employment of special bond counsel in connection with the issuance of the Certificates, and, accordingly, the law firm of Foley & Judell, L.L.P., Bond Counsel, is employed as Bond Counsel to the Issuer to handle all matters of a traditional legal nature in connection with the sale, issuance and

delivery of the Certificates. The fee of Foley & Judell, L.L.P., in connection with the program of finance is established and fixed at a sum not to exceed that permitted under the Attorney General's approved schedule for comprehensive bond counsel service for revenue bonds based upon the principal amount of Certificates actually issued, sold and delivered, plus "out-of-pocket" expenses. A certified copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to the Attorney General of the State of Louisiana for approval of the employment herein provided.

SECTION 6. As the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Investor Protection Act (the "Act") provides that certain professionals giving certain advice relative to the issuance of indebtedness must be registered an Independent Registered Municipal Advisors ("IRMA"), the Issuer hereby retains Nnamdi Thompson of Government Consultants, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, Registered Municipal Advisors, to act as its Independent Registered Municipal Advisor pursuant to the provisions of the Act and Final Rule adopted by the Securities and Exchange Commissioners on September 20, 2013 and the adopted final release (the "Release"). The Issuer hereby acknowledges that it is represented by Nnamdi Thompson of Government Consultants and that said Nnamdi Thompson is an IRMA and shall offer advice on structure, timing, terms and other matters relating to the Bonds, upon which the Issuer may rely. The fee for such services shall, whenever possible, be payable from the proceeds of the Bonds and the amount thereof shall be subject to approval by the Issuer and subject to the approval of the State Bond Commission.
